3/4S have had another busy half-term!

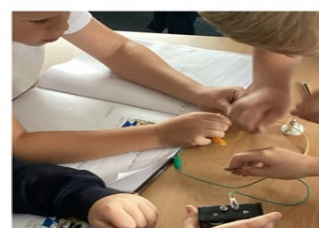
Our Year 4 children started the half-term with a residential at Tattenhall. We had a fantastic time spending time together and enjoying the activities.

The children had an amazing time on the Tattenhall residential including building a shelter and hammock and completing orienteering.



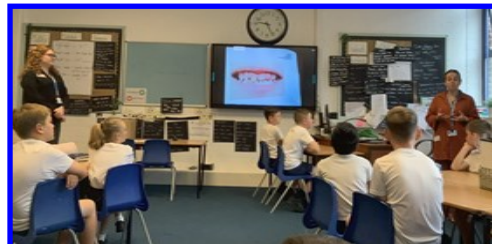


### Year 5 Mrs Atar and Miss Welsh

The school kitchen cook meals to order every day. This means that if you have not pre-ordered a meal, we will call you at lunch time to bring a packed lunch into school.

From 1st September 2025, school meal prices will increase to £3.10 per meal / £15.50 per week.
